April 14, 2025

A regular meeting of the Water and Sewer Board of Commissioners was held at 5:30 p.m. in the Village Office. Present were Chairman David O'Hara, Commissioners: Robert Sauer, Andrew Clark. Also, present were Village Clerk Lynnette Carver, Superintendent of Public Works John Heller, Camden Group President Ken Scherrieble, Trustee Shawn Prievo, and Queen Central News reporter Doug Cleveland.

Commissioner Clark made a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting as written. Comm. Sauer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Comm. Clark made a motion to pay all audited water bills on Abstract # 11 in the amount of \$10,467.21 and all audited sewer bills on Abstract #11 in the amount of \$14,427.30. There were no Capital Project-Sewer Plant bills. The motion was seconded by Comm. Sauer and carried unanimously.

Camden Group President Ken Scherrieble submitted his report to the Board:

Water:

- ❖ Total Coliform sampling on 3/13.
- This month the lead chemical feed pump began making whining noises. We monitored and performed all preventative maintenance as well as lubricating in an attempt to correct the problem. It was an internal problem with the pump, leading us to need to purchase a new one
- ❖ Prior to the purchase, we had changed the interior pump and roller assembly.
- ❖ We needed to replace both the lead and lag chemical feed line check and ball valves, and fittings, multiple times this month due to leaking parts. The valves we currently use are not rated for sodium hypochlorite use, but are a much less expensive alternative. We would like to move toward using the appropriate parts.
- We currently do not have a working computer for the water plant. We are utilizing and Camden Group laptop in the interim, but we need a new computer for the water plant.
- ❖ We ordered a new pH probe this month, because the previous probe had cracked. These are advised to be changed every 2 years.
- ❖ The sodium hypochlorite solution tank was emptied, scrubbed and put back into service.
- ❖ We replaced all the cartridge filters, both 1 and 5 microns, in both filter trains.
- ❖ We had a Department of Health inspection on 3/24.
- ❖ Gartners was on site 3/25 and 3/26 to service/rebuild both the raw water pumps.
- ❖ Routine cleaning of CL-17.
- Lead and lag chlorine metering pumps integrity inspections, and general cleaning performed weekly; lubrication added as needed.
- State DOH Report was completed and mailed.
- General cleaning and maintenance conducted. -

Sewer:

- ❖ Composite samples were collected & sent to the lab on 3/17 & 3/27.
- ❖ We continue to operate both the inner and outer ditches, with the number of solids consistently decreasing as we are able to process more with the belt filter press.
- ❖ We were able to handle the wet weather through the month, with worry about clarifier overload or solids leaving the plant untreated, while we had both ditches operating. The main problem with both ditches in service is the lack of appropriate mixing and air provided on the rear side, as we can only utilize one rear aerator at a time.
- Exercised the generator weekly.
- The county has changed from UPS to FedEx for the Covid sample pick up. We missed a couple of weeks of sampling during the change, but are scheduled going forward.
- ❖ The flow meter was calibrated on 3/19.
- The generator was serviced on 3/21.
- Cleaned clarifier trough, skimmer arm and weirs, skimmed out plastics and grease that accumulate daily.
- Maintain free flowing splitter box, where more rag tangles and plastics accumulate before passing into the clarifier.

- Pressed sludge for a total of 11,919 dry pounds.
- ❖ Deep cleaning of clarifier, including the backside, ceiling and effluent basket.
- Deep cleaning of headworks, removing all collected rag tangles from the backside of bar screens
- General cleaning and service.
- Performed Daily/Weekly/Monthly PM on system.

Superintendent of Public Works John Heller reviewed his report with the Board.

Land spreading, Card Ave., Liberty Street pump station, and the reservoir were discussed.

Clerk reported:

Online water & sewer payments option will be suspended for April 1st to July 1st. Monthly financial statements from Treasurer Meagher were reviewed.

As there was no further business to discuss, Comm. Clark made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:19 p.m. The motion was seconded by Comm. Dust and carried unanimously.
